It has been a particularly difficult time for businesses affected by Covid-19, a broad range of supports have been made available through the Local Enterprise Office, in addition to Employment Wage Subsidy Scheme, Restart Grants and Failte Ireland Adaptation Grants. The introduction of the CRSS (Covid Restrictions Support Scheme) from October will in summary, provide a weekly cash payment to businesses that are effectively closed or only able to trade at a fraction of their previous turnover because of pandemicrelated restrictions. The payment will generally be a percentage of their turnover for 2019, up to a maximum payment of €5,000 per week while restrictions last ("restricted period"). The scheme will apply from 13 October 2020 to 31 March 2021 but may be extended to 31 December 2021 if necessary. More details are available at www. revenue.ie.

With a number of large pharmaceutical companies at an advanced stage in the trial and delivery of Covid-19 vaccinations, there is reason for hope and optimism that in the year ahead, life will return to normality, but in the meantime we must all play our part in limiting the spread of the virus by following all of the public health guidelines and looking out for one another. I hope this newsletter will give you insight into some of the initiatives I have been working on at Offaly County Council and the work that has been carried out at a local level across Offaly. #### **Shannonbridge Power** Station

In February 2020, I tabled a motion to Offaly County Council, which was unanimously supported by the full Council; "Offaly County Council collaborate with the Just Transition Commissioner and the ESB to maintain Shannonbridge Power Station in its entirety once it ceases to generate electricity, whilst identifying and developing opportunities to utilise the facility for tourism, remote working and cultural & educational purposes that will benefit the village of Shannonbridge and the surrounding area." There is an abundance of opportunity for this valuable and strategic site, and it is incumbent on all stakeholders to work together to ensure its long term sustainability through diversity. The government announcement of over €10 Million Just Transition Funding for Offaly is welcome and will ensure a sustainable future for the county.

#### **Road Sweeper Rota**

Offaly County Council provide a comprehensive road sweeping service. Wherever possible, it is encouraged to leave roadways and footpaths free of vehicles on scheduled days in your area, to provide full access for the road sweeper and maximise benefit of this helpful service. I have called on the Area Engineer to include areas such as Cadamstown and Dunkerrin on the schedule for 2021.

#### Investment & Improvement in Offaly Roads

There has been significant progress made in improving roads across the county, with an allocation of  $\leq 14.6$  Million for all associated works in the past calendar year. Additionally, the Governments July Stimulus package saw an over 70 projects across Offaly allocated over  $\leq 1$  Million in funding under three different schemes. The Birr Municipal District received funding allocation under the different schemes as follows; Town & Village Renewal ( $\leq 100,000$ ), Active Travel  $\leq 271,000$ ) and Climate Change ( $\leq 51,000$ ). All projects are expected to be completed before the end of the year.

### **Community Centre and Church WiFi Broadband Connection Points**

Significant resources have been applied to communications infrastructure developments across Offaly, under both the National Broadband Plan and initiatives at Offaly County Council such as WiFi4EU and Department of Rural and Community Affairs, administered through the dedicated Broadband Officer for the county. I have worked with several communities to deliver this important resource, providing working hubs and learning centres, and assisting church masses to be streamed across every town and village where there is a demand, as we deal with the challenges posed by Covid19.

#### Birr Primary Care Centre Update

The delivery of a Primary Care Centre for Birr has hit yet another barrier in recent weeks, with the HSE advising that they will no longer be proceeding with the Rectory field as a potential site. This is a vital piece of infrastructure for Birr and the surrounding area to ensure state of the art health care provision for all. I have made several representations to the HSE, and they have now outlined a timeline for the delivery of Birr Primary Care Centre by Autumn 2022, but we must now be provided with comprehensive details regarding the location and the process to deliver this crucial facility on time.



€3.5 Million Public Street LED Lighting Energy Efficiency Project for Offaly



# LED Lighting Upgrade for ALL Public Lights

Since February 2015, I have tabled motions calling for Offaly County Council to upgrade its full suite of public lighting to LED. Over 3,000 of the counties 8,000 public lights have been upgraded to LED to date. A proposal was approved in October, working with neighbouring counties, to convert all our county lighting to LED. It is estimated that the project will cost €3.5 Million to upgrade the remaining 5,000 public street lights. Transport Infrastructure Ireland are responsible for approximately a further 1,000 units, most of which are upgraded to LED.

This initiative is a major step forward in maximising the efficiency and safety of public street lighting across the county, which will result in reduced maintenance and energy costs, whilst improving the quality of public street lighting. It is estimated that savings will amount to  $\leq$ 3.8 Million over ten years, with the project essentially paying for itself, an important factor and contributing to reduced carbon emissions for the county.

It is imperative now that Offaly County Council work with local communities and conduct a full study of the lighting stock across the county and use this opportunity to ensure areas inadequately served by public street lighting at present would see improvements. Additionally, once the public street lighting upgrades are paid, that the annual savings would be ring-fenced for community focused initiatives'. The upgrade initiative is expected to commence once the project has been agreed by all County Councils across the region.
